Lieutenant Colonel L distinguished leadership on Operation OKRA underpinned Task Group 632's mission to Advise, Assist and Enable Iraqi security forces. His leadership, innovation and engagement enabled Iraqi Special Forces to improve capability, capacity and will to achieve positive outcomes in the Iraq campaign. Lieutenant Colonel L's actions are in keeping with the finest traditions of Special Operations Command and the Australian Defence Force.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL (DSM)

Captain M

For distinguished leadership in warlike operations as the Special Forces Advisory Team Commander, within Special Operations Task Group 632, Operation OKRA.
